

#### Anointing of the Sick/Eucharist –

#### Upon request after the 4:30pm Mass in the Chapel.

Prior notification is necessary by calling the rectory Monday-Friday. Also call the Rectory if someone is sick or housebound.

**Marriage** – arrangements must be made with a priest 1 year in advance. Only individually registered parishioners of one year or more are eligible to be married here and includes anyone still living at home with parents who should register individually.

#### **R.C.I.A.** (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)

Anyone interested in becoming Catholic is invited to become part of the RCIA. This process begins with a journey of faith that culminates in full communion with the Church through Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. This process is open to those who are not baptized, to those who have been baptized in other Christian denominations, or to baptized Catholics who have never received catechetical instruction or received Confirmation and First Communion. Further information is available by calling the Rectory.

**Sponsors** – Must be a Confirmed Catholic of at least 16 years of age in good standing and active. If married, must have been married in the Catholic Church.



# Thanksgiving Liturgy Nov. 26th



# What I Learned from a Year in Honduras



In August I came back to the U.S. after living and working for a year at an orphanage in Honduras. For twelve months I ate more corn tortillas and beans than I care to remember, cohabited with scorpions, attempted to keep four of the world's cutest special-needs second graders from taking the last of my sanity, and learned to like hugs that were dusty, sweaty, and long at waist height. The experience was life-changing, and this parish made it possible.

About a year and a half ago I spoke at Masses about the volunteer year I was beginning at Amigos de Jesus orphanage. I was inspired and humbled by the outpouring of generosity and support I received. Throughout the year I heard about so many of you who continued to support me in prayer.

Now that I'm home, I would like to share some of my experiences with you: of the children's heartwrenching stories and incredible resilience; of daily life in the third-world country I called home for twelve months; and of the work being done by this home, started by a Philadelphia priest, to get at the heart of the problems that forced hundreds of Honduran children to flee their country for the U.S. this summer.

Join me on Monday, November 17th at 7 p.m. in the Parish Center for stories and conversation about my year at Amigos. Thank you once again for your incredible support. I'm really looking forward to sharing some of the things I learned with you.

Dear Father Rocco:

I write to express my gratitude to you for arranging at your parish the collection to benefit the Hospitaller Brothers of Saint John of God. The Saint John of God Brothers has ministered in our diocese since December 1965. Their labors on behalf of special needs children and their families are well known by our people. Aware of their reputation among the priests and the esteem in which they are held by the faithful of the diocese, I did not hesitate to suggest to you the collection after I was briefed by the superior of the Community, Brother Thomas Osorio, O.H., concerning the suffering and devastation caused by the Ebola virus to their personnel and to their medical facilities in Liberia and Sierra Leone.

In the name of the good and generous people of Camden on October 9<sup>th</sup> I presented to the provincial, Brother Killian Keaney, O.H., a check for \$102,424.80. Since October 9<sup>th</sup> we have received an additional \$29,548.20, which increases our total contribution to \$131,973.00. This money will be used to assist the continued presence of the Saint John of God Community in West Africa despite the life threatening situation they continue to face.

I would ask that you relay my gratitude and that of the Brothers of Saint John of God to your people. Our diocesan contribution encourages these missionaries in their apostolate and will assist them to purchase much needed supplies. May the good Lord bless each of your parishioners who contributed to this collection. Their generosity will be repaid by the Lord many times over.

Please know of my personal gratitude to you Father for arranging this collection. I am once again proud to be your bishop.
