

Anointing of the Sick/Eucharist -

Upon request after the 4:30pm Mass in the Chapel.

Prior notification is necessary by calling the rectory Monday-Friday. Also call the Rectory if someone is sick or housebound.

Marriage – arrangements must be made with a priest one year in advance. Only individually registered parishioners of one year or more are eligible to be married here and includes anyone still living at home with parents who should register individually.

R.C.I.A. (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)

Anyone interested in becoming Catholic is invited to become part of the RCIA. This process begins with a journey of faith that culminates in full communion with the Church through Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. This process is open to those who are not baptized, to those who have been baptized in other Christian denominations, or to baptized Catholics who have never received catechetical instruction or received Confirmation and First Communion. Further information is available by calling the Rectory.

Sponsors – Must be a Confirmed Catholic of at least 16 years of age in good standing and active. If married, must have been married in the Catholic Church.



May CAP Schedule

The Office of Child and Youth Protection is announcing CAP (Child Assault Prevention) sessions. CAP is the safe environment training program for adults who have regular contact with minors. Attendance is required in order to comply with the USCCB's *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*. The policy of the Diocese of Camden is that adults will attend CAP once every five years.

CAP 1 teaches attendees to recognize child abuse and neglect and how to report to the proper authorities. Adults are taught that children have the right to be safe, strong and free. CAP 1 is for new volunteers and employees.

CAP 2 is called *No More Bullies, No More Victims* and is a workshop addressing bullying awareness and bullying prevention. Cyber-bullying is also presented.

CAP 3 is called *Cyber-Empowerment* and is a workshop which promotes adults understanding of cyber activity of youth while teaching them realistic ways to help children keep their own rights and guard the rights of others in the cyber-sphere.

Each presentation is 90 minutes.

Adults who are new employees or volunteers should attend CAP 1 before attending CAP 2 or CAP 3. After five years, adults have the option of attending CAP 1, 2 or 3 when they renew their CAP.

WHY DO WE ...

Offer the Lord's Prayer at Mass?

Praying the Lord's Prayer as a community has been mandated in public prayers from the earliest centuries of the Church. At one time these words given to us by Jesus, were prayed by the priest only on behalf of the congregation. Today we are welcome to join in this prayer which is truly a summary of all the Gospels. In the Roman Catholic Mass, The Our Father and the Doxology are separated into two distinct prayers, instead of the combined version of many Protestant faiths.

During the Our Father, the priest will hold his arms extended, palms up, offering the prayer to God. There are several acceptable postures for the congregation. The traditional posture for prayer of hands together over the heart, arms extended to God, or families joining hands are all appropriate, as long as the posture supports the reverence of this prayer.

The sign of peace has its origins in the very early Church, but was removed by the Council of Trent, as the practice had become removed from its purpose. Three hundred years later it was re-instituted as a reminder that we are a community and that we are all equal in God's eyes. As we offer a sign of peace to our neighbor, it is not our peace that we offer, but the peace of Christ. A kiss to a family member, a handshake or just simple eye contact, accompanying the words "Peace be with you" is appropriate. The wish should be offered solemnly to your immediate surrounding neighbors. In this sign of peace, we demonstrate our reconciliation with one another, in keeping with God's command to love your neighbor, before we approach the altar to receive Christ.

Become Engaged

Most of us have prayed the Our Father since we were small children. Over time the beautiful message of this prayer can be lost to rote recitation. When you pray the Our Father, focus on the words, perhaps by changing which word is given emphasis, or focusing on one or two particular lines of prayer each time. This can help to keep the message fresh and relevant to you. As you focus on the words, a line or two may feel especially pertinent to your life at this time. Offer it to God in recognition of your need for Him in your life.

Offer the peace of Christ to your neighbor honestly and generously. As Christ comes to help heal our hearts, the sharing of His peace can help to heal the unseen pain and lessen the burden of those around us.
