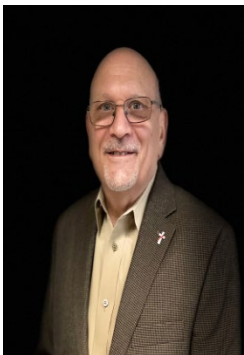
Dear Parishioners,
